


Proposed Lochluichart Wind Farm Extension II

Loch Luichart Estate along with wind farm developer Infinergy is currently investigating the potential to extend the operational Lochluichart Wind Farm. Infinergy was behind the development of the Lochluichart and Lochluichart Extension Wind Farms.

After an initial feasibility review and on-site environmental assessments, the possibilities for a further extension are beginning to take shape. Now Infinergy would like your input! To ensure the local community is fully consulted on the plans, we would like to invite you to our Community Open Days to have a look at and discuss proposals with the team.

Having gained feedback from numerous environmental bodies, the council and the local community we will further develop the design of the proposed scheme and bring the final version back to you before submitting the application to the Scottish Government and The Highland Council.

Finally, Lochluichart Wind Farm Extension II is a bit of a mouthful, so you'll see we've abbreviated it to 'LXX' for some things, including the website. Please feel free to use either version whenever you get in touch with us.



The Proposed Plans

- Extend the existing development of 23 turbines by up to 9 turbines at the north end of the site.
- Up to 9 wind turbines with an approximate capacity of 3.6MW each could add up to 32.4MW to the existing capacity, bringing the total installed capacity up to over 100MW.
- The height to the top of the blades, when one of the blades is in a vertical position, would be a maximum of 150m.
- Submission of the planning application is expected in early 2018.

Why this site in particular?

- Good average wind speed: proven site well suited for wind energy.
- **Sited** away from large numbers of residential properties.
- Extensions reduce the need for new sites and in turn reduce the cumulative impact of development.

Community Benefit

The area has a well-established Development Trust, the LCT, and newly formed Garve & District Development Company in place to help the community become more resilient and sustainable over the long term thanks to the community benefit from the Lochluichart and Lochluichart Wind Farm Extension projects as well as funds from the Corriemoillie Wind Farm. Additional funds from this new extension would allow even more good causes to be supported locally.




Proposed Lochluichart Wind Farm Extension II

Working together with the Estate, wind farm developer Infinergy is now seeking to extend the operational Lochluichart Wind Farm.

The Environmental Impact Assessment surveys are now all complete and are being collated to form an Environmental Statement to support a new planning application to The Highland Council. Before this is submitted, in order to ensure the local community is fully consulted on the plans, we would like to invite you to our Community Open Day to have a look at and discuss our proposals with the team.

Following the flash floods in August 2017, one of the key issues to be addressed by this project will be how to reduce any potential flood risk, and the disruption it causes, in the future.

The final version of the proposed development will then be submitted as a major planning application to The Highland Council for consideration later this year.



Why this site in particular?

- Good average wind speed: proven suitable for wind energy.
- **Existing infrastructure** including access roads and grid transmission lines are already in place, minimizing disruption.
- Extensions reduce the need for new sites.

The Proposed Plans

- Extend the existing development of 23 turbines at the north end of the site.
- Up 9 wind with turbines an approximate capacity of 4MW each could add up to 36MW to the existing capacity, bringing the total installed capacity to approximately 100MW.
- The height to the top of the blades, when one of the blades is in a vertical position, would be a maximum of up to 150m.
- **Submission** of the planning application to The Highland Council is expected in summer 2018.

Community Benefit

The area has a well-established Development Trust, the LCT, and newly formed Garve & District Development Company in place to help the community become more resilient and sustainable over the long term. This is funded by the community benefit payments from the Lochluichart and Lochluichart Wind Farm Extension projects as well as funds from the Corriemoillie Wind Farm. Additional funds at £5000 per MW of installed capacity from this new extension would allow even more good causes to be supported locally, including the addition of more electric vehicle charging points along the NC500 in the area.
