Subject: Non Material Variation - Lochluichart Wind Farm Extension II Redesign (21/02985), relating to submissions submitted in tandem pursuant to Wind Farm **Condition 7 Micrositing beyond 50m limit**

Introduction

Further to our telephone discussion on 13 June I write enclosing a request for a Section 64 Non-Material Variation to the above planning permission which relates to elements of wind farm access track (and associated construction) to be located beyond the micrositing allowance of 50 metres specified in condition 7.

Background

At this pre-construction stage an initial civil engineering review has confirmed the need for the micrositing of certain elements of wind farm infrastructure. Whilst the majority of changes are within the micrositing allowance of 50 metres (details of which are made in a tandem submission pursuant to condition 7) we discussed on 13 June 2023 that the following elements which are in part beyond the 50 metre limit should be sought in a tandem non-material variation application for completeness:

realignment of the western access track spur, which leads from the existing main access track to (a) serve turbines T6, T7 and T8.





(b) as a result of the relocation of T8 (which is within the 50 metre micrositing limit as set out in the tandem submission to condition 7), there is a consequential relocation of the turning head to a location north of the turbine.

Following initial discussions with Highland Council Planning department, the Applicant (Bluebell Wind Ltd) is now seeking a formal non-material variation under Section 64 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 (as amended) to address these minor changes.

This submission comprises this covering letter and attached figure entitled 'Stage 1 Micrositing layout' dated 13th June 2023.

Non-Material Variation

The non-material variation sought is shown in attached figure entitled 'Stage 1 Micrositing layout' dated 13th June 2023.

The context and summary of changes sought by this NMV is as follows:

- (a) an engineering review, supported by site geotechnical investigations and discussions with turbine manufacturers has confirmed that the first part of the consented access track spur (c.250 metres in length) leading from the existing central access track to consented wind turbines T6, T7 and T8 was too steep for turbine delivery vehicles as it cuts directly across the contour lines. A review of the constraints has confirmed that a more shallow gradient can be achieved by relocating this track further north, a change which will also avoid a relocation into deeper peat.
- (b) the engineering review, supported by site geotechnical investigations and discussions with turbine manufacturers has also provided further detail as to the likely track routing to T6, T7 and T8 including the location of turning heads, and identified the need to relocate T8. Whilst the majority of the newly proposed track alignment and the relocation of T8 remain within the agreed 50m micrositing area, some small areas will fall outside the 50m limit, particularly when considering the wider access track/crane pad foundation and turning head works as set out in ES Figure 3.3. Notably the turning head to turbine 8 will need to be to the north of the relocated turbine which is a variation from the indicative ES Figure 3.3 where the turning head was shown to the south of the turbine.

The civil engineering arguments for accepting this relocation are therefore as follows:

• The original track alignment was inefficient and would have resulted in excessive cut and fill, and would have been very challenging in terms of access track gradient.

In terms of the environmental constraints at the Site, and as set out in the original ES, the revised track layout continues to avoid deep peat, impacts on groundwater dependent terrestrial ecosystems (there are none on site) and has no worst impact in terms of water crossings.

Assessment against NMV Guidance

As you know, Highland Council has published web-based guidance which specifies various criteria against which a non-material variation is assessed. In summary these seek to ensure that the 'proposed changes will not significantly change the scheme that was originally granted planning permission'.

An assessment against the specified criteria is set out below.



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

ASSESSMENT

The amendment extends the track access and turning head approximately 140m north of micro-sited T8. Other sections of the track exceed the original micro-siting buffer by approximately 25m.

There are no concerns that the amendments will significantly impact deep peat, watercourses, habitats, or protected species as noted by SEPA and NatureScot. These statutory consultees have also been consulted on the related submissions for the satisfaction of pre-start planning Condition 8(d) – Micrositing Allowance (22/00244/PSCON).

Given the scale of the overall development, it is considered that the amendments are non-material. This NMV regularises the change to the approved development as required in the micrositing condition.

DELEGATED DECISION

The revision to the approved plans should be treated as a non-material variation in accordance with Section 64 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 (as amended) and the original consent amended accordingly.
